GREEN POEMS FOR A BLUE PLANET and VERSE FOR THE EARTH



Eco-comical and thought-provoking, the poems highlight the threat humankind poses to the future of the planet. The books are brilliantly illustrated by Wallace and Gromit creator Nick Park. Verse for the Earth was supported by international charity WaterAid and Bristol European Green Capital City 2015. Poems from the books have also been published in one of the world's longest running comics — The Beano, as well as in an OUP textbook for primary school teachers and an Indian book for English language learners.

From 'disappearing tigers' to 'lost whales' and from 'footballing aliens' to 'poo power', the show explores what it means to be green (or not!) and is accompanied by Nick's projected illustrations.

Since first performing the poems in 2009 for Nobel Laureate scientist Frances Arnold and publishing the books in the UK, Martin has performed on one of the UK's most popular children's television programmes — BBC's Blue Peter as well as on BBC Radio 4. He has performed from Los Angeles to China, India to Dubai, and the Edinburgh Fringe to the Royal Albert Hall. His performances also include the International Green Awards Ceremony at London's Natural History Museum, Ways for Peace Festival at Tintern Abbey, Green Apple Awards Ceremony, the Eden Project, Latitude Arts Festival, Ledbury Poetry Festival, Ilkley Literature Festival, Bath Literature Festival and a performance backed by orchestra at Bristol's Beacon. He was Poet in Residence for Bristol 2015 European Green Capital and in 2016 he was awarded an honorary doctorate for his poetry and environmental work by the University of Bristol.

Workshops


Martin also runs green poetry workshops for mixed-age groups and for children in schools and at festivals. His has given workshops in Malta, India , China, Dubai, and closer to home at Bath, Birmingham, Bristol, Conwy, Leeds, Slough, Southampton, and Wigan. Martin writes his poems on junk and materials that go off (or don't go off) to recycling. In the workshops children get the opportunity to write their poems on trash, litter, plastic bottles. Almost any old rubbish! His recent book Inversebrates teaches aspiring poets how to write using many different forms of verse as well as introducing the reader to invertebrates along the way!


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CHARITY WORK

Martin has worked with numerous charities to highlight their work through poetry performances and workshops. His collaboration with Aardman Animation on the Green Poems for a Blue Planet Shaun the Sheep resulted in its sale at the Shaun in the City auction which raised over one million for The Grand Appeal and Wallace and Gromit Children's Charity.

Working with WaterAid, he encouraged children and young people to enter into a national water-themed poetry competition that reached more than 1.3m people, inspired young writers and spread awareness about the water crisis and WaterAid's work.

Martin also worked as Poet in Residence for charity Frank Water. The residency inspired him to write the world's first epic eco-poem King Frank and the Knights of the Ecoquest, a children's book based on true-life experiences of the charity's founder Katie Alcott MBE. He was a judge for The World Land Trust's poetry competition and has also performed for Buglife and Penny Brohn UK.
